Joint Working Project Summary	This project reflects collaboration between Ipsen, and The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre (CCC) within the remit of a joint working project to support a Renal Cell Carcinoma (RCC) Service development. The project will run for 24 months. The principal aims of this joint working project comprises of redesigning and enhancing the renal care service for outpatients both at CCC and sector hubs: to provide renal specialist clinical care and to optimise the patient pathway. This will result in a more efficient and joined up service.
